



He Can Do 'Anything!' Canada's Multi-Talented Jacob Hoggard to Host CTV's Broadcast of THE 2015 JUNO AWARDS, March 15

TORONTO (February 24, 2015) – CTV and The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) announced today that <u>Jacob Hoggard</u>, lead singer of the JUNO Award-winning band <u>Hedley</u>, is set to host **THE 2015 JUNO AWARDS** broadcast on CTV and <u>CTV</u> <u>GO</u> from Hamilton's FirstOntario Centre on **Sunday**, **March 15**, live at **7 p.m.** (**8 p.m. AT**) (check local listings to confirm broadcast times). Pulling double-duty as host and performer, Hoggard – also nominated for three JUNO Awards this year – brings his explosive energy and no-holds-barred attitude to the stage for Canada's biggest night in music, proving that he really can do 'anything.'

"Jacob's career has skyrocketed over the last decade, and it is an absolute honour for CTV to work with him again as host of **THE 2015 JUNO AWARDS**," said Phil King, President, CTV, Sports and Entertainment Programming. "Jacob brings boundless energy and amazing charm and charisma, along with a loyal following of fans, to his role as host of Canada's biggest night of music."

"It's been wonderful to watch Jacob grow from an energetic hellion 10 years ago into a gifted songwriter and one of Canada's top frontmen," said Allan Reid, President & CEO CARAS, The JUNO Awards and MusiCounts. "I can't wait to see what he has in store for us all in Hamilton."

"I've known Jacob for over 10 years and from the very first day I met him, it was clear that he was an enormous talent," said John Brunton, Chairman & CEO, Insight Production Company Ltd. "It's been an absolute thrill to watch him grow over the years: he's a first-class songwriter and a killer front man, and I couldn't be more proud to have him as our host of THE 2015 JUNO AWARDS."

"It's an honour to host this prestigious celebration of Canadian music," said Jacob Hoggard. "I'm excited to see some amazing performances, make a bit of a mess backstage, and help hand out some JUNO Awards in the Hammer!" Arguably one of Canada's most vibrant, gifted, and successful musicians, Vancouver's Jacob Hoggard continues to break new ground on all fronts. In 2004, Hoggard, then an unknown local musician, left his construction job and jumped into the Canadian entertainment world on what was then the nation's biggest television program, CTV's CANADIAN IDOL. There, Hoggard captured the hearts of millions of television fans. Later that year, he formed a new band, Hedley, with local B.C. musicians and friends, Dave Rosin, Chris Crippin, and Tommy MacDonald. In 2005, Hedley signed their first major record deal with Universal Music Canada and released their self-titled debut album, which has since sold more than 200,000 copies. Since then, Hoggard and the band have equaled this with their next four albums, Famous Last Words (2007), The Show Must Go (2009), Storms (2012), and Wild Life (2014), launching them into the "Million Albums Sold" club that only a select few Canadian artists have achieved.

Hedley has won two JUNO Awards for "Pop Album of the Year" (*Storms*), and "Video of the Year" (*Perfect*), and is nominated for three 2015 JUNO Awards including "JUNO Fan Choice Award*", "Single of the Year", and "Album of the Year*".
